




## Miguel Munoz Collection Part II



Rare coins can be owned and admired by a single collector . . . or can be shared with the world through exhibits, lectures and research. Those numismatists that enrich the hobby by sharing their enthusiasm and knowledge are truly what coin collecting is all about.

Miguel L. Munoz is just such a person. Munoz was born almost 70 years ago in San Julian Jalisco, Mexico. His lifetime of devotion to the coins of Mexico can be traced back to 40 centavo coins that a young Munoz received in change for candy purchased from an old woman. The little boy noticed that on one coin the eagle was skinny; on another, the national bird of Mexico was fat. He then examined all of the different dates on the

40 coins Fate had decreed he receive. Thus, a coin collector was born. To this day ... over half a century later, the distinguished hobbyist and scholar, Miguel Munoz, still has some of those original centavos in a very special place.

Miguel Munoz has contributed generously to the knowledge of others through frequent lectures, articles and books which have become "standards" in his field of specialization. He has been the featured speaker at several ANA Conventions (Houston, Washington), the New York Metropolitan Show (twice), several times at the Azteca in Los Angeles, as well as at Long Beach, Dallas, Hamilton and Calgary, Canada. He has also presented a paper at the First Centennial of the Societe Numismatique Francaise in Paris.

Even a brief listing of his numismatic activities is truly impressive. Memberships include: the American Numismatic Assoc., Fellow of the American Numismatic Society, former President (1959-1966) of the Sociedad Numismatica de Mexico, Founder and Present Director of the Academia Mexicana de Estudios Numismaticos, Fellow of the Royal Numismatic Society (London), plus TAMS, OIN, Azteca and many others.

Miguel Munoz is also certainly one of the most active authors in the distinguished Numismatic Literary Guild, with over fifty articles to his credit. He has won the Heath Literary Award, presented annually by the ANA, an amazing five times.

Miguel Munoz, the "Dean of Mexican Numismaticists", has prepared "The First Mint of Mexican Insurgents" (1968, Sociedad Numismatica de Mexico). "Historia Numismatica del Estado de Mexico" (1975 Government of the State of Mexico), "El Real de Ocho, Primera Moneda Universal" (Formento Cultural Banamex) and "Tlacos y Pilones la Monedo de Pueblo de Mexico" (Formento Cultural Banamex), reflects twelve years of research. His most recently published work is "Anthology of Mexican Numismatics" published bi-lingually in Spanish and English.

It is expected that the sharing of Miguel Munoz's in depth collection with the numismatic fraternity will see the coins of America's southern neighbor rise to new levels of popularity. This can be credited to Miguel Munoz's systematic approach to both collecting and research . . . . his legacy to all future generations of numismatists.
