

A silver medal of Mexico is a beautiful work of art. It is also a very definite part of the history of Mexico. If you want to add beauty to your collection, I would suggest that at the next coin convention you attend, go to your favorite dealer and ask about the Silver Medals of Mexico. If you do not have one or more of the Silver Medals of Mexico in your collection you are certainly missing a beautiful work of art.

There are many series of "The Medals of Mexico". How many Medals and how many series it would take to make a full and complete Collection, has yet to be answered.

It is hard to find the older Medals as so few were minted. Many have been lost. There are some collectors that have a few of these old Medals, and treasure them very highly.

Some of the Medals that were coined later contain the same beautiful work of art. Each is a part of history. I think that the medals are especially nice for the young collector, as they tell part of the history of the country. From the Medals they learn, a great part of the history, of the great country of Mexico. It is much easier to remember a history lesson from a medal than it is from a book.

THE SILVER SITUATION IN MEXICO

The Mexican Government needs Silver. The Government has ordered all banks in Mexico, to buy up Silver Coins of the past over their face value. They are paying bullion prices for this coinage. It is being shipped to Mexico City for Smelting. This will have a very serious effect on the coin market. The price on old coins with high Silver content has been rising for sometime and will continue to rise as they become more scarce. Any coincontaining .900 fine silver is a good investment at anywhere near bullion price.

The silver obtained from melting down the old coins is not being used to mint new coins. It is being diverted into industrial uses. As Mexico becomes more industrialized they will need more and more Silver for industry.
