

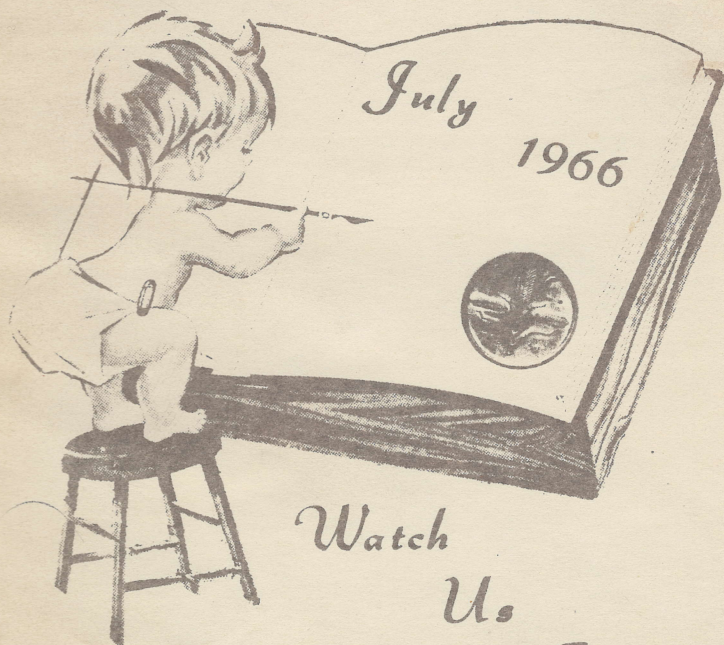

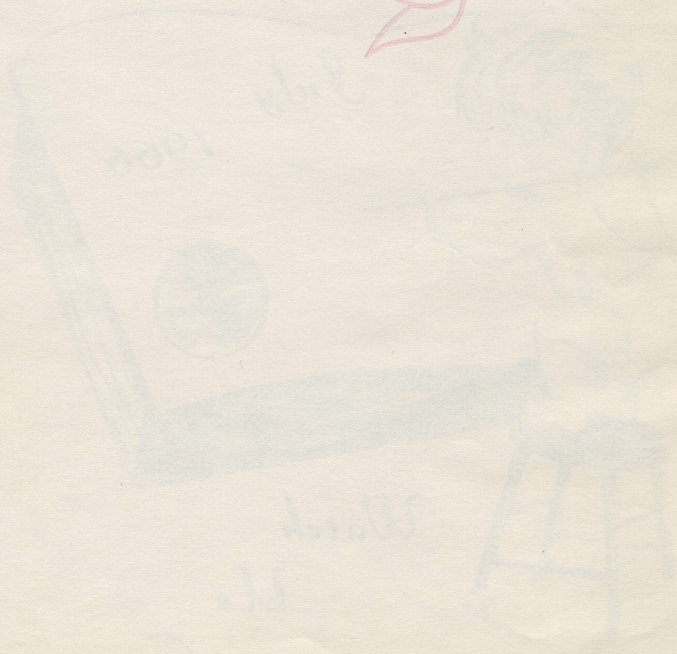

A silver medal of Mexico is a beautiful work of art. It is also a very definite part of the history of Mexico. 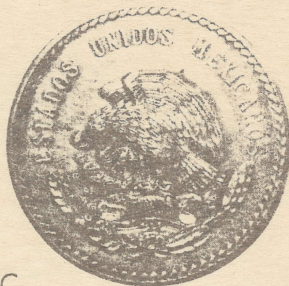

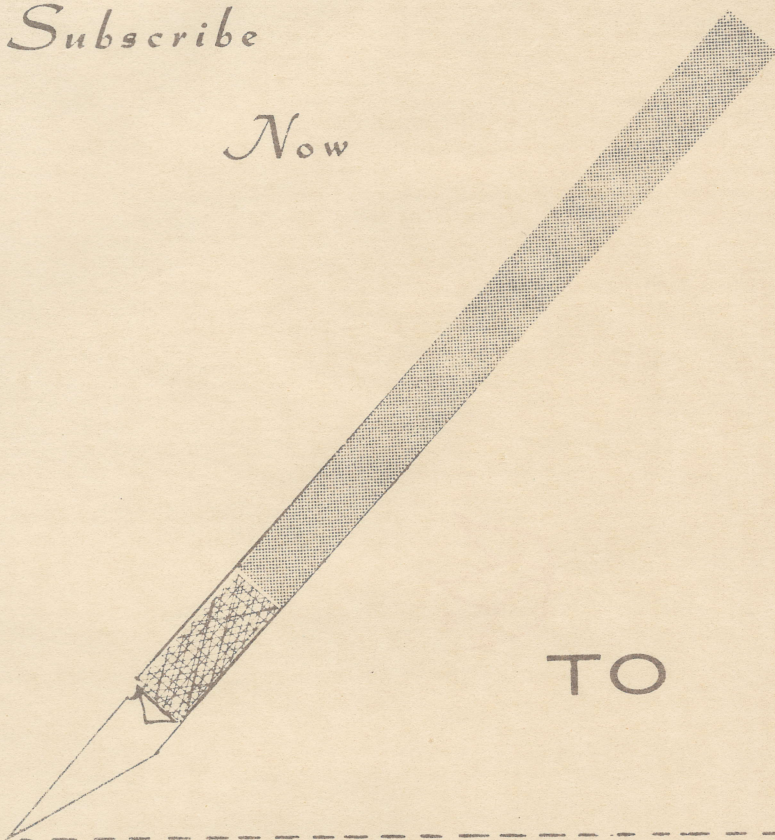

The Silver crowns of Mexico are considered among the most beautiful in the world. Mexican craftsmen have long been noted for their excellent work with Silver. Mexican Silver services are still in demand and are bringing very high prices.

The Silver trimmings for bridles and saddles are some of the most beautiful we have ever seen. All of this takes the Silver away from the mints.

Is it any wonder that the Silver content of coinage is gradually being dropped? There are still many of the old coins available in both the Crown size and the decimal money.
