## CONDITIONS OF SALE.

---

The metal in which the coins are struck is indicated thus:—

*A* = gold, *AR* = silver, *Æ* = copper or bronze.

*El* = Electrum (an alloy of gold and silver).

*Bl* = Billon (an alloy of silver and copper).

Care is taken to describe accurately the condition of coins and medals, using the following scale: *Extremely fine*, *Very fine*, *Fine*, and *Good*. Where no condition is stated it may be assumed that the coins and medals are not in good condition.

# FOREWORD.

---

For numismatists and collectors of the unusual in the way of coinage, here is an opportunity of acquiring some pieces that are not likely ever to be offered again. This collection is limited strictly to coins issued by Revolutionary forces in different parts of Mexico during the troublous years of 1913 to 1917 inclusive, and if some of the specimens are crude in design and workmanship, this defect makes them the more interesting, on account of the difficult conditions under which they were made. With forces usually on the move and with no permanent headquarters, occasion had to be taken of their occupancy of mining camps, sugar mills, blacksmiths' shops, or other places where there was some kind of machinery to improvise coin for the payment of the troops and to serve as a circulating medium in the districts occupied. The issues of coin were, of course, subsidiary to the issues of Revolutionary fiat paper money which circulated during these years.

With the triumph of the "Constitucionalista" forces about 1917 and the disappearance from circulation of all paper money about that time, owing to its having ceased to have any purchasing power, the coinage of the period also disappeared, and was substituted by Government issues of gold, silver and copper coins, none of which come into this collection. For several years, therefore, little interest was taken in making collections of the Revolutionary coinage, but about ten years ago a few collectors began to look out for new specimens, and one or two dealers in the United States used to make periodical trips to Mexico with the object of picking up what they could for re-sale in the former country.

The supply has, however, now become extremely limited, in fact, almost exhausted, and no new pieces coming to light, these visits seem to have ceased about five years ago, and although the American dealers keep in touch with one or two collectors or dealers in Mexico City, they apparently are unable to add anything to their collections.

This collection now offered for sale is believed to be, without question, the nearest to complete in existence, and as it contains some coins that are the only known specimens, hunters of rarities will have an excellent opportunity of adding to their treasures.
