



## COPIES OF MEDALS.

The following are copies made by the various processes of electrotyping and casting in type metal and other metals; they are from the collection of the late Dr. Winslow Lewis.

Collectors will no doubt be surprised to find in the collection of Dr. Lewis, so many pieces of this character, but the fact is easily explained. Some of the older coin collectors doubtless remember the old French adventurer and coin seller, who called himself Daniel E. Groux. While living in Boston, this man made the acquaintance and received the confidence of Dr. Lewis, who became his patron and from time to time lent and gave him money. Groux entered into an arrangement with Wyatt, of New York, of Pine Tree and Good Samaritan shilling notoriety, to manufacture these medals. Wyatt having previously made many sets of casts of the National Medals which had been purchased at liberal prices by different persons, the Doctor who appears always to have been Groux's creditor, was induced to make large purchases of these casts. It may fairly be said of them, they are excellent of their kind, are regular in form and thickness, and for easts, unusually fine and sharp. They are well finished and amongst them will be found medals, the originals of which it would perhaps be impossible to procure.
